

Walk with - Police constable "Taffy" Jones * P.R. 28. over district bounded on the ^{south} ~~east~~ by North Cross Road and Upland Road; east by Barry Road, Peckham Rye + Rye Lane; north by Chouinert Road and west by Bellenden Road, Masted Road, Adys Road, Goose Green + Lordship Lane, being portions of the parishes of All Saints, ~~St. Lawrence~~ and St John the Evangelist.

P. C. Jones is a big beefy man of 40 with a full, jolly looking face and a fund of humour & contentment that nothing can disturb. He is a Norfolk man & has had seventeen years service in the East & West Dulwich sections. He was examined for promotion 12 years ago but failed to pass & is now looking forward to his pension. Altho' not a scholar he has as a shrewd sensible man with a good record - only one caution during his service.

We started from the East Dulwich Police Station at the corner of Upland & Crystal Palace Road & went west along North Cross Road. . Poor class of 2 st. shops

This completed the day's walk.

General Notes. The area covered in this walk


includes two poor patches: (a) In East Dulwich between Cawthron Grove & North Cross Road and (b) Peckham between Churnet Road & Nutbrook Street. In both areas the labouring element preponderates: the main difference being that whilst the Dulwich area is gradually improving, the Peckham area is as gradually becoming poorer, chiefly owing to the increased rents, which are driving the better class workers further afield to find cheaper house room. In both areas the people are decent though often rough working folk; the only really bad spot being Rye Dwellings.

North of Upland Road to East Dulwich Road is a lower middle class area - shoals of silk hatted people leave these roads every morning for the City. The roads are wide, most of the houses have good gardens & very little change has taken place here during the past 10 years except in the filling of empty houses - an unoccupied house is very rare now.

Jones (P.R. 28) over district bounded on the west by Red post Hill & Dulwich High St; south by East Dulwich Grove & East Dulwich Road; east by Adys Road, Maxted, Bellenden & Victoria Roads and north by Chadwick Road, the railway, Grove Hill Road, Champion Hill & Denmark Hill being the parish of St Saviour and parts of the parishes of St Matthew & St Paul, St John

Started from corner of Bellenden & Choumert Rds. N up Victoria Road. 2½ st private houses on W. side. Mostly used for some trade: bootmender, photographer, umbrella mender. Pink as map. Other side is 3d. shops. should be Pinkbarred. W. with Chadwick Road. 2½ st houses with two families in some. Others keep a servant. Comfortable. Gordon Brewery & open ground on north side. Pinkbarred as map. Back & west along Choumert Road. 2 st. houses; most with bay window. Houses vary much in style but a gradual improvement toward Copleston Road. Working class; building trades &c near Bellenden Road. Clerks, travellers sit at upper which might be Pink barred. Pink instead of Pinkbarred of map.



General Remarks. Much open ground still remains between Denmark Hill and the railway and except near Red Post Hill is not likely to be built over soon. Several cricket and tennis clubs use these fields and on Saturday they are the scene of much activity. In the valley near the Railway are the St Saviours & Camberwell Informaries, both huge establishm'ts. They On Sundays they bring streams of visitors along Grove Lane and an almost equal stream of their occupants going in the opposite direction toward Camberwell. Grove Hill Road & the streets ^{to} the east of Dog Kennel Hill have deteriorated within recent years and the neighbourhood has become a punk band & punk district, ~~which~~ This will probably be its permanent status. In the Roads near East Dulwich Station a similar change has taken place accompanied by a great rise in rents.

Walk with F.C. Jones (P.R. 28) over district bounded by Lordship Lane on the east; East Dulwich Grove on the north and west; and by Townerly Road on the south, being parts of the parishes of S. John & S. Clement.

Started from the corner of Lordship Lane, west into Matham Grove. Well built 2 st houses with large bay windows. Some occupied by 2 families; others kept by one. Music teacher &c. Pink as map. W. to Tell Grove. Small two-storeyed houses: some flush with pavement; others with small forecourt & bay window. Labouring people. Purple as map.

Ashbourne Grove. 2 st. semi-detached houses. Conf. working people. Clerks, people on morning papers. Few, if any servants. Pink as map.





a wedge of closely built and thickly populated

want but just able to live a ~~com~~ decent life
while

while trade is good but with little or no reserve for bad times. During the past 10 years this neighbourhood has improved wonderfully and rents have risen rapidly; in some cases nearly doubled. The streets are quieter and the people more orderly. One feature of the district is the large number of off beer houses especially as compared with fully licenced houses and this notwithstanding the fact that several of these licences have been abolished. The child with the beer jug is constantly in evidence. On the other hand very few grocers (e.g. bottle) licences exist. Some of the draught licences are associated with grocers' shops but as a rule a separate entrance is provided in these cases.



One or two servants at least. Mundania to Red Therapia Road. Similar to Mundania but not
quite so good. Gardens smaller back & front. Red.
Marmora Road 2 st & attic. semi detached. Trees
planted along road. All keep servants but not so good
as previous road. Many to be let or sold. One is
shored up - brick work cracked. Red.

Honestall Road has no houses. On the west side
are cricket fields while on the east the Southwark
& Vauxhall Water Company is extending their works
& reservoir accommodation.

General Notes

This ^{walk} completed the East Dulwich section
so far as the area included in the Paris map
is concerned. As a whole East Dulwich
may


may be described as a working class district with a fringe of middle class on each side. This is emphasized by contrast with West Dulwich, which is entirely middle class. All the West Dulwich constables live in East Dulwich, said Jones. They cannot get accommodation in their own district.

Very little crime in the district; practically none of a serious character. The number of charges is small and they ~~are~~ mostly arise out of drink.

I think the publichouses are fairly well conducted & there is very little if any collusion between the police & publicans - certainly not in East Dulwich. He would not like his inspector to know he drank whilst on duty for £20 nor would he like to be seen entering a publichouse. The Supt. is very sharp upon men for this "and rightly so". One man lost his pension a while ago.

Very little prostitution. Only place where prostitutes live on the ground is Rye & Bldgs. Some women from the Borough come to Peckham Rye. Very low class but not many of them.

P.C. Jones has a very good knowledge of East Dulwich & is thoroughly reliable there. Did not know Peckham + Denmark Hill so well & the districts his power is not as good.

General Remarks.: Dulwich College & Alleyn's College are the dominant factors in this neighbourhood. The increase in the number of red streets is due to the demand by families who send their children to these schools as dayboards. Comfortable Germans also affect this district.


On General Subjects Jones had spoken more, particularly to G.S.A.: he had differed with him, he said, only on the question of prostitutes. Jones is convinced that the only remedy lies in recognition & licensed houses. Peckham Rd is much used by the Borough Rd prostitutes
