General Notes. The children usually go to the Ward schools; many to Sir John Cass's (Charity) School, which accommodates 700 children. Of this number, 200 are clothed and provided with a dinner every day. Nearly all these schools offer some special advantages and the poor people stay in the City because of the charities for which they become eligible.

There is only one board school on these blocks - Gravel Lane - . The fee is 1^d; it was formerly 3^d and then about half the fees were remitted; now the people pay.

The number of children on the district has declined since the School Board's institution, probably one-half.

There were then four visitors in the city; now there are but two. The number of children has decreased every year in Mr Eisenstadt's district until the present, when the number is the same as last year. There are now 3148 children.



Interview with Mrs Cutler (parochial mission woman) at Miss Marshall's, 37 Grosvenor Road.

St John's Buildings, Smith Square. may be left as pink. Had sunk rather lower than usual, some short time ago owing to a caretaker, a most idle drunken man who made no enquiries as to character of the people to whom he let the rooms (especially if they had something to drink with them). Fortunately for the property & the other inhabitants of Smith Square, he ran away a short time ago with a female living in the Buildings, & under the auspices of a fresh & energetic caretaker it is regaining its character. Is very much better than Lion Buildings.

Smith Square has deteriorated very much of late years, mainly owing to the erection of St. John's Buildings, although there are several good people still there, but as a rule the better inhabitants go further afield as their leases run out. Very different population round here now than that of 20 years ago.

Spilton Street, was some time back a nice respectable place. The houses were well built & were occupied by decent people who in many instances kept the whole house, & had lived there for many

years. The demolition of several streets of miserable little hovels, to make way for the large blocks of Buildings between Great Peter & Victoria Streets, caused the inhabitants (who would not or could not pay the regular rents demanded at the Buildings) to migrate into the surrounding district & through an enterprising man, who had managed to secure two old houses & convert them into a common lodging house, these undesirable gentry managed to secure a footing in Spilton Street, which was further ^{increased} ~~improved~~ by the ~~erection~~ ^{erection} of Lion's Buildings, which copied all the defects, without any of the virtues of the Peabody. Mr Ludford, a large farmer & next potted in the street in an old cab yard & the houses previously occupied by the cabmen, were taken by his employes, a very rough class of men; while Mr Ludford himself seems to bear a very bad character. These 3 causes, aided no doubt by other minor ones have, according to Mrs Cutler, who has lived here almost all her life, ~~been~~ brought this street gradually down from its pink & red position to the light blue one, & it seems to be sinking even below the latter.

They pay special attention to young girls who come up to London & try hard to reclaim them before they get too brutalized by the life, to render the work of rescue almost impossible.

(Erected by Mrs. Barker Harrison, a philanthropic lady who worked for many years in Westminster. She received a great deal of support, especially from Lord Shaftsbury. They were intended for the postmen who found the rents of the Peabody Buildings too much for their pockets, but unfortunately no provision was made for their barrows, so they have not resorted hither in such numbers as were expected, although the rents were very much lower than the Peabody. They are with few exceptions two-room tenements, there being a very few of three rooms & about the same number of single rooms. Every tenement is numbered.

Mr. Simpson was a young hard working curate with thoroughly liberal notions. His knowledge of his people (like any other young fellow's) was rather scrappy, although he evidently liked them & had a good word to say for the most degraded; but he did not pay that attention to details such as no. & ages of children &c. that particularly characterizes the lady visitors, still I should think that the information which I have obtained was quite trustworthy. His general notes about the people I have subjoined on the following page.

The lowest class of the people never by any chance take to regular honest labor even when it is obtained for them. They begin life as crossing sweepers, match sellers & or go round with beggars, although it may be noted that they work a good deal harder as children than they do in the later years of their life. The Board school in Stoneferry Road is too good & the pressure brought to bear upon them by the Visitor (who has all this poor congested district to attend to) is very slight & can be easily eluded. & so many of them grow up unable even to read or write. although their parents find them very useful.

When people are living bad lives it is not much use getting them married, as the man will most probably turn his wife out into the streets as a prostitute, & claim her gains as his ^{as his} rightful husband.

The people are very jealous of each other. If anything is to be given to them, & the distribution of prizes or any charity by the Church is very warmly resented by the non-recipients, although at the same time they are extremely liberal to one another.

The people of the lower types do not suffer very much from
